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Peter C. W. Gutkind recently retired from McGill University, Montreal, where he had been Professor of Anthropology, 1963-1986. He has also taught at various African universities, was on the staff of the East African Institute for Social Research, 1953-1959, and also taught at the University of the West Indies. He is currently Professor and Visiting Overseas Research Fellow, Department of Sociology, University of Warwick, Coventry (U.K.). He has published widely and only recently gave up his Senior Editorship of the Sage Publication Series on African Modernization and Development which resulted in 15 volumes. His main interests continue to be in urbanisation in the Third World, and the study of class and political consciousness of Third World workers. He is currently writing a history of the canoemen of southern Ghana.

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
